

International Program: The Nudgee Beach Experience



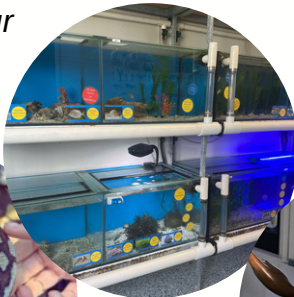
Program itineraries are developed in consultation with the booking school.

The introductory session includes an acknowledgement of Country explaining the strong connection to land and sustainable practices used by the Turrbal and Jagera First Nation Peoples in the local area.

During the day, students will be immersed in the different places of Nudgee Beach through a range of investigations to understand and experience the marine ecosystem. Through this immersive approach students will understand their connection to the ecosystem, positively engage with natural environments and reflect on their connection to ecosystems in their own country.

It is possible to do a combination of some of the following activities on a full day visit depending on the tide.

- Mangrove Boardwalk (Tabbil Ban Dhagun - meaning place of saltwater)
- Sustainable Fishing using reels along Kedron Brook Floodway - (Running tide)
- Intertidal study including yabby pumping, fine sieving and/or Shorebird watching. (Low Tide)
- Intertidal fish study including dragnet fishing. (High Tide)
- Meet some of our Centre animals
 - Buck or Jenny (Mud crabs)
 - Kabul (Coastal Carpet Python)
 - Pinkin (Freshwater Turtle)
 - Nudge (Blue Tongue Lizard)
 - Marine Fish Tank Tour
